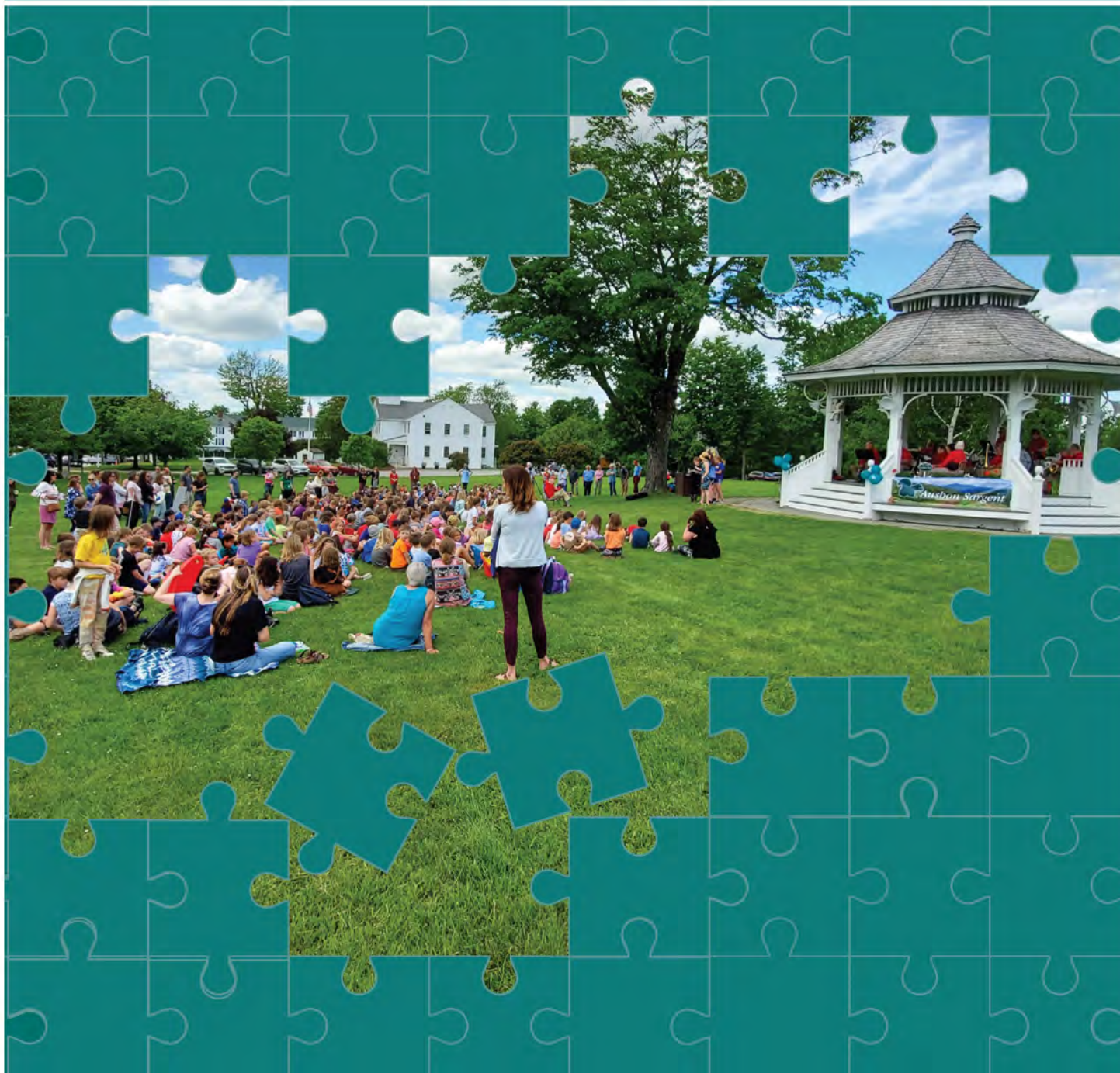

**We Are All A Piece of the Puzzle**

## From the **Executive Director:**



**It is Ausbon Sargent's 35th anniversary** and what a year it has been for the land trust! We're excited about several conservation projects underway, including properties in the Lake Sunapee, Cassey Brook and Bradford Bog watersheds.

Since its 1987 beginning, the land trust has focused on preserving the rural landscape of the Mt. Kearsarge/Ragged/Lake Sunapee region. Thanks to the generosity of many supporters, over 20 square miles of land has been protected encompassing 163 properties.

Our goals during this milestone year are to connect people with the land and broaden the public's understanding of the complexity and community value of land conservation and stewardship. Numerous hikes and events have been scheduled on a variety of lands including natural areas, wildlife habitat, farmland and productive forests in our 12-town service area.

Behind the scenes the staff and the Land Protection Committee have been involved in a lengthy process of data collection to update our Conservation Plan, initially adopted 10 years ago. We're adding new information from the most recent NH Wildlife Action Plan, parcels conserved since 2012 by Ausbon Sargent and others, removing parcels and areas which have been developed, and adding information concerning climate change resiliency and other changes or improvements in available data since 2012.

Recently we reviewed individual map layers including water resources, wildlife habitat, unfragmented lands, soils, resiliency, and the resource co-occurrence map. During July and August, we will meet with conservation commissions to discuss their towns' resource co-occurrence map to determine which lands are the highest priority for protection. By calendar year-end, ASLPT's conservation focus areas should be delineated and strategies for protection implemented.

The Winter 2022 Chatter highlighted Pat Thornton's meaningful unrestricted bequest to the land trust. The Board designated a portion of the bequest to be added to our Land Action Fund. This fund provides interim financing to facilitate land conservation transactions when there is a shortfall in achieving a fundraising goal. Whenever monies are borrowed from the Land Action Fund, the Board determines how the fund should be replenished.

In March, the balance of Pat Thornton's bequest was used to establish the Land Management Fund. With the increasing number of fee ownership properties (in addition to conservation easement properties), ASLPT's obligations to manage the lands we own places a growing long-term financial responsibility on the land trust. This new fund will help pay for expenses such as survey work, drone monitoring, trail maintenance, signage, mowing of fields/trails, invasive species management, forest management plans, as well as habitat and view management.

As we wrap-up FY22, we say farewell to our longtime Operations Manager Sue Andrews and Bookkeeper Patsy Steverson. We wish them the very best and look forward to their continuing contributions as volunteer easement monitors.

# Ausbon Sargent: A Piece of the Big Puzzle

The National challenge:  
**Protect 60,000,000 acres by 2030 – Where do we fit in?**

**The Ausbon Sargent Land Preservation Trust is an important piece of the land protection “puzzle.”** In NH, there are currently 28 active land trusts, which have protected a total of 1,285,373 acres of land. Instead of having a business-like mentality in which there is competition, land trusts work together, forwarding people with questions to the appropriate land trusts for their specific areas, and sometimes working with each other to serve as “back-up” easement holders if needed. Within the entire United States, there are 1,281 land trusts, which have protected 61,072,596 acres of land! Working towards the same common goals, each land trust, especially those like Ausbon Sargent which are accredited by the Land Trust Accreditation Commission, follows specific guidelines in order to protect important natural areas. We are all focused on the land and its importance to the world we share. Over the next 8 years, the scientific community’s proposal to protect another 60,000,000 acres (30% of our nation’s lands and waters) can come to fruition. This goal is being called “30x30.” By educating the public about land trusts and the importance of land, I believe there will be a domino effect of land protection activity. This is an achievable goal!

A lot has been done in the realm of land conservation over the span of 35 years. Since 1987, The Ausbon Sargent Land Preservation Trust has completed 163 projects, totaling 13,226 acres; that’s more than 20 square miles of land! There are multiple benefits of protecting the land, including the protection of wildlife habitat and corridors, drinking water, lakes, rivers and streams, farms, forests and fields, and the views we treasure as we travel along our rural roadways. In our own little corner of the world, we can appreciate the work we have done and be grateful for those towns, landowners and supporters who have worked alongside us to do it. But, we must take a wider view and recognize that we are not alone in our efforts; as part of a larger group of like-minded organizations, we have done and will continue to do some amazing things.

Too many people have witnessed development in the natural areas that they once enjoyed; special places from their childhoods that have been changed in ways that can never be reversed. I’ve heard the phrase “asphalt is always the last crop,” which is sobering; it enforces the importance of land trusts as being instrumental in the health of our planet and its inhabitants. Challenged with the 30x30 goal, land trusts across the country are working together to help relieve the negative effects of climate change and pollution, and to allow for a better quality of life for all living things. Isn’t it amazing that we, a small land trust in one region of one of the smallest states in the nation, can actively help to save the very planet we call home? With your continued support, and the continued work of land trusts throughout our nation, we can make a difference that will matter for the generations to come.

# Ausbon Sargent Day 2022

## Thirty-Five Years

Every five years, the land trust plans a celebration to help educate and remind those in the area about our namesake, Ausbon Sargent.

The event is an opportunity to introduce the elementary school children to the story about a man who gave everything he had saved during his lifetime to purchase some important land and give it to the town to leave forever undeveloped. We hope that the children will remember the story and share it with their families. We hope that they will come to recognize the little teal squirrel signs they may see in their travels, and understand that the land those signs mark are also a part of the story. By understanding how important the land is, and was to Ausbon Sargent, they may begin to feel a little bit of ownership over the lands they frequent, and begin to see them as something of value that ties us all together.

This year, the event was held on June 8th and was attended by over 450 people. The New London Elementary School children participated by taking turns reading the Ausbon Sargent story out loud for all to hear. They also sang the Ausbon Sargent song, to the tune of "She's a Grand Old Flag." The Kearsarge Community Band filled the air with wonderful, summertime melodies, and the Town's Select Board chair, Nancy Rollins, proclaimed it "Ausbon Sargent Day" in the Town of New London. Seymour the Squirrel made an appearance and spent time with the excited children who wanted a high-five or a hug. It was a wonderful program; the very kind of activity that Ausbon Sargent wanted to keep happening on the Town Green, which is why he purchased it, and gave it to the Town for future generations to enjoy.

We should all be thankful for the foresight that Ausbon Sargent had; this town would look a lot different today had someone else purchased that parcel of land. And I wonder what the land trust's name would have been if Ausbon hadn't inspired a movement within the Town of New London.

## Stewardship: Looking Ahead

*Ausbon Sargent Land Preservation Trust has conserved over 13,000 acres in 35 years, but our work doesn't end when the conservation easement is signed or property ownership is transferred to us, rather it's just beginning. Stewarding the land is a never-ending commitment, which takes time and money to perform.*

Stewarding a conservation easement property owned by a private landowner is an ongoing relationship (or series of relationships over time) that has to be managed and maintained. Landowners who place easements on their properties understand the commitment they've made to conservation, and subsequent landowners need to understand and honor this same commitment. Many landowners work closely with Ausbon Sargent as they manage their forests, agricultural fields, and recreational opportunities. Staff and volunteers conduct annual monitoring visits, typically in the fall, to ensure compliance with the terms of the conservation easements. Staff members keep busy answering questions from landowners and checking in on activities like timber harvests, new agricultural fields, and new structures each year.

When the ownership of a conservation easement property changes hands, our staff takes time to meet with new landowners to go over the terms of their conservation easement, as the terms of this easement are a permanent part of the deed. Discussions about the new landowners' plans for the land begin, keeping in mind the same commitment to conservation as the original landowners. Many new landowners are eager with ambitious plans that require time and visits from us to ensure that management of the property is held to the highest standard. We work with these new landowners over time to steward the land and honor the terms of the conservation easement.

Stewarding a property that Ausbon Sargent owns is also an ongoing project. When land is transferred to Ausbon Sargent to own and manage, the signed paperwork is truly just the beginning. By accepting the property, we have made the promise to maintain the integrity of the land, manage the forest sustainably, and permit or create recreational opportunities where appropriate. This year, Ausbon Sargent started a Stewardship Committee to help with the management of our owned lands. With some funds made available through a generous bequest, we also created a Land Management Fund to help with the expenses that come along with owning lands. This new fund will help the land trust maintain open spaces, trails, wildlife habitat, and manage forests. As landowners, we have been working to inventory properties we own, make management decisions to improve wildlife habitat and improve forest health. While some forests will remain wild with little human intervention, others will be managed with timber harvests and active work to create diversity in forest structure and age. This diversity makes for a more resilient landscape and offers a variety of habitats.

Looking ahead, the commitment Ausbon Sargent has made to these conserved lands has just begun. We will continue stewarding our conserved lands, working hand-in-hand with landowners and professionals, to ensure the resilience of our beautiful landscape forever.

- Is subject to a conservation easement held by the Newbury Conservation Commission

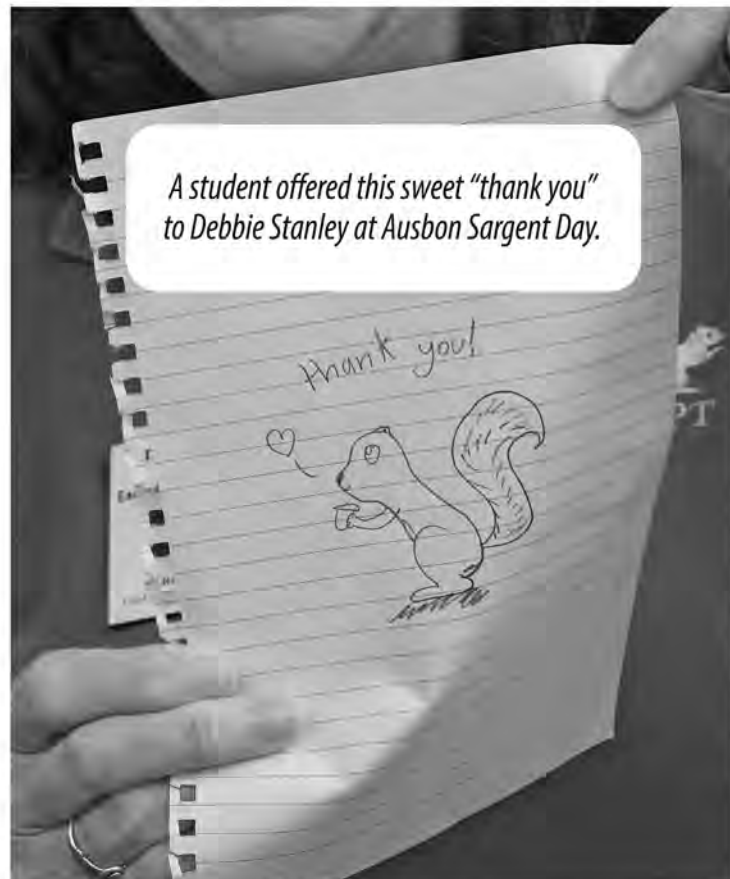
### ***Special Announcement***

## **NH Department of Environmental Services Explains the Aquatic Resource Mitigation Fund:**

When there are unavoidable impacts to streams and wetlands, the Aquatic Resource Mitigation (ARM) Fund offers an alternative to permittee-responsible mitigation. An In-Lieu Fee (ILF) payment may be made to the ARM Fund to compensate for losses to aquatic resources and functions from a project. The funds are pooled according to nine watersheds called Service Areas, and then made available as competitive grants to fund preservation, restoration and enhancement activities across the state. As the ILF sponsor, NHDES holds and manages the collected funds, and announces a grant round (i.e. Request for Proposals) annually. The goal of the program is to support conservation activities that are ecologically important and will effectively sustain aquatic resource functions in the watershed for the long term.

*Applying for and receiving these grant monies involved a long process; Ausbon Sargent is thankful to have been chosen as a recipient for an ARM grant for the Between the Mountains Preserve.*



## Woods Without Gile

### NH Outstanding Tree Farmers of the Year

Congratulations to Ann and Marc Davis for their Outstanding Tree Farmer of the Year Award! Ann and Marc purchased their 470-acre property in 2002 with the focus to manage timber, protect wildlife habitat, open space, and the watershed. Located in both Springfield and Wilmot, the Davises named their property "Woods Without Gile" as a play on its location next to the John F. Gile Memorial State Forest.

Historically, this property was part of a hill farm village known as Fowlertown and it still contains the cellar holes of various homesteads. Ann and Marc have opened Woods Without Gile to the public for non-motorized recreation such as fishing, hiking, hunting, cross-country skiing, snow shoeing and horseback riding.

At the start of their relationship with this property, Ann was walking with forester Paul Mulcahey to do a timber inventory. Paul noted to Ann that if they wanted birds on site, they would need to cut some trees because the forest had been untouched and was largely dense. Since then, timber management has been used to enhance the health of the forest and increase the diversity of wildlife. Their written forest management plan was essential. Licensed forester Tim Wallace wrote their initial management plan and continues working with the Davises on the updates. Partnering together, Ann, Marc and Tim provide outstanding management of this tree farm that balances open space, wetland, and wooded habitats.

To ensure that their tree farm continues in perpetuity, the Davises put a conservation easement on the property in 2007 with Ausbon Sargent. The easement is a legal agreement that restricts the development of land and conserves the natural resources to fulfill the Davises conservation ideals.

## IN MEMORIUM



**Joe DiClerico**

It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the death of Joseph DiClerico, Jr., on April 2, 2022. Joe was a Board member of the Ausbon Sargent Land Preservation Trust from 2010 to 2019, serving as Secretary for the last four of those years.

Although he grew up in Nahant, Massachusetts, he and his family enjoyed summer vacations at Twin Lake Villa, and Joe became familiar with New London and the surrounding area. His attachment was so strong that after graduating from Williams College and Yale Law School, he settled on the shore of Little Lake Sunapee. In 1975 he married Laurie Breed Thomson of Swampscott, Massachusetts and New London, one of the best decisions he ever made, according to Joe. Their daughter Devon was born in 1978.

Joe's legal career began in 1966 when he served as law clerk to the Honorable Aloysius J. Connor, United States District Judge for the District of New Hampshire. The following year he served as law clerk for the five Justices of the NH Supreme Court. For two years he was an associate with Cleveland, Waters and Bass in Concord. In 1970 he became an Assistant Attorney General for New Hampshire and in 1977 began his judicial career as an Associate Justice of the New Hampshire Superior Court. Governor Judd Gregg appointed him Chief Justice of that court in 1991. His career as a federal judge began in 1992 as a District Judge on the United States District Court for the District of New Hampshire, serving his first five years as Chief Judge. In 2007, rather than retire outright, he became a Senior Judge, carrying a reduced caseload, and he continued in that capacity until his death.

Both Laurie and Joe shared their time and talent with Ausbon Sargent. Laurie worked as the Development Associate from 2001 until 2016 and is currently a member of the Board. Joe brought energy, curiosity, and serious consideration to every decision that came before the Trustees. He was a careful listener who thought about both short and long term impacts. Generous with his time and grateful for this community, Joe was willing to add to the usual six-year tenure of a trustee to serve three more years as an officer. The Board was delighted to have the additional time to benefit from his wisdom, leadership, and wry sense of humor. He influenced the direction of Ausbon Sargent and contributed substantially to its success. We are grateful for all he did to support Ausbon Sargent's work and we will miss him.

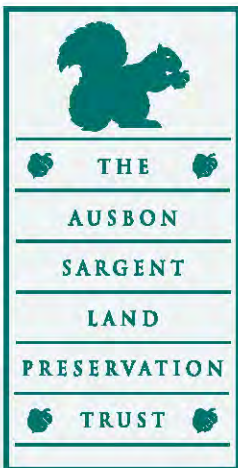
